In The Name of Allaah, The Most Merciful, The Bestower of Mercy.

Negatives

Allaah [The Exalted] said:

"Do you (faithful believers) hope that they will believe in your religion inspite of the fact that a party of them (Jewish rabbis) used to hear the Word of Allah [the Taurat (Torah)], then they used to change it whilst they know?"

Meaning: They knew that they have distorted it or they knew the punishment for distorting it. (1)

"And when they meet those who believe (Muslims), they say, "We believe", but when they meet one another in private, they say, "Shall you tell them (Muslims) what Allah has revealed to you (about the description and the qualities of Prophet Muhammad Peace be upon him, that which are written in the Torah), that they (Muslims) may argue with you about it before your Lord?" Have you then no understanding? Know they not that Allah knows what they conceal and what they reveal?"

"And there are among them are unlettered people, who know not the Book, but they trust upon false desires and they but guess".

Meaning: Ibn Abbaas [may Allaah be pleased with him and his father] said, "They do not want except what they utter out of lying" or "They do not know the understanding derived from the scripture, rather they only know what they hear being recited to them". (2)

Meaning: They are not upon certainty, so they follow their religious leaders

whether they are lying or telling the truth. (3)

"Then woe to those who write the Book with their own hands and then say, "This is from Allah," to purchase with it a little price! Woe to them for what their hands have written and woe to them for that they earn thereby".

[• فَوَيْلُ]: Then woe

Al-Qaadhi Iyaad [may Allaah have mercy upon him] stated that the word "Waylun- Woe" has some of the following meanings: it is used whilst refering to one who has fallen into destruction. It is used whilst refering to one who deserves destruction. It is used to refer to destruction itself. It is used to refer to the difficulty found in punishment. It is used to refer to grief. It is used to refer to a valley in the hell fire. (4)

Positives

لَيْسُواْ سَوَآءً مِّنْ أَهُلِ ٱلْكِتَّبِ أُمَّةٌ قَآبِمَةٌ يَتْلُونَ ءَايَـتِ ٱللَّهِ ءَانَآءَ ٱلَّيْلِ وَهُمْ يَسُجُدُونَ يُؤْمنُونَ بَاللَّهِ وَٱلْيَوْمِ ٱلْأَخِرِ وَيَأْمُرُونَ بَٱلْمَعُرُوفِ وَيَنْهَوْنَ عَنِ ٱلْمُنكَرِ وَيُسَـّرعُونَ فِي ٱلْخَيْرَاتِ وَأُوْلَنَهِكَ مِنَ ٱلصَّـلِحِينَ

"Not all of them are alike; a party of the people of the Scripture stand for the right, they recite the Verses of Allah during the hours of the night, prostrating themselves in prayer. They believe in Allah and the Last Day; they enjoin Al-Ma'ruf (Islamic Monotheism, and following Prophet Muhammad) and forbid Al-Munkar (polytheism, disbelief and opposing Prophet Muhammad); and they hasten in (all) good works; and they are among the righteous".

Ibn Abbaas [may Allaah be pleased with him and his father] said, "When Abdullah Bin Sallaam - who was from a group amongst the Jews - accepted Islaam, their rabbis said, 'None believes in Muhammad except the evil amongst us'", so Allaah revealed this verse:

[كَيُسُواْ سَوَآءً مِّنُ أَهُلِ ٱلْكِتَابِ أُمَّةٌ قَآبِمَةٌ يَتُلُونَ ءَايَاتِ ٱللَّهِ ءَانَآءَ ٱلَّيْلِ وَهُمْ يَسُجُدُونَ - Not all of them are alike; a party of the people of the Scripture stand for the right, they recite the Verses of Allah during the hours of the night, prostrating themselves in prayer]. (5)
